Teachings of the New Church

The king of Syria means people who possess cognitions of truth, though at this point in the contrary sense he represents those who possess cognitions which have no connection with truth. Elisha represents the Word of the Lord. Dothan means matters of doctrine drawn from the Word. Chariots and horsemen and the large army which the king of Syria sent means falsities of doctrine. The mountain full of horses and chariots of fire surrounding Elisha that were seen by his servant means goods and truths taught by doctrine drawn from the Word. The blindness with which those were struck whom the king of Syria sent there means utter falsities. Their being led by Elisha to Samaria where their eyes were opened, means instruction given through the Word. Secrets of Heaven 4720:2
