When we "take up our cross and follow Him" (Mark 8:34) we too go through struggles in which the Lord fights for us and brings us by regeneration from brokenness to wholeness. The circle is a symbol of the Lord's nfinite love embracing all people.

for their work in the Caregiver's Compass. We striv to be compassionate, full of faith, skilled and trustworthy, relating to the four directions in heaven. "The state of goodness corresponding to the east, and the state of truth corresponding to the south are more inward states, while the state of goodness corresponding to the west and that of truth corresponding to the north more outward



(Secrets of Heaven 9648). The symbol in the center is

formed from the Greek letters X (chi) and P (rho), an abbreviation for Christ (Greek XPI Σ TO Σ), meaning that the Lord is at the center of everything we do as Stephen Ministers. "Since everything that comes from the Lord looks toward Him, the Lord is the common center" (*Heaven and Hell* 124).



About Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministers provide high-quality, confidential, Christian care and support to people experiencing grief, divorce, cancer, job loss, loneliness, disability, relocation, and other life difficulties. Our goal is to be a supportive, caring presence. Each Stephen Minister will spend about an hour a week with someone in need, listening, being supportive, and perhaps praying and sharing a passage from the Word.

Stephen ministers are not counselors or pastors – they mostly provide compassion, listening intently and sharing the sorrows and joys of those they care for, and referring them to other kinds of caregivers as needed. In the early Christian church the apostles became too busy to attend to all the needs of widows and orphans, so they chose Stephen and six others to provide care to those in need, so that the apostles could continue to focus on preaching the Word (Acts 6). Today Stephen Ministers follow the same tradition, providing lay care to people in need so that pastors can continue to focus on preaching the Word.

Stephen Ministries was started in 1975 by the Rev. Dr. Kenneth Haugk, a Lutheran pastor and clinical psychologist. Having little time as pastor to give the kind of care his flock needed, he began training lay people to give high-quality care, combining Christian principles of love for others and compassion, with sound psychological insights and experience. Today over 13,000 congregations from over 180 denominations use the Stephen Series training program to train, organize and supervise over half a million Stephen Ministers.
