Teachings of the New Church

People who have the faith that comes of charity take notice of [another's] good qualities. Whatever evil or falsity they may see, they excuse it, and if they can, they work to correct it in the other, as the present passage says Shem and Japheth did. People who lack neighborly love see nothing in their neighbor besides that neighbor's evil. If they see anything good in the person, they either dismiss it or put a bad interpretation on it.... Those who are guided by kindness, on the other hand, hardly even notice evil in another but pay attention instead to everything good and true in the person. When they do find anything bad or false, they put a good interpretation on it. This is a characteristic of all angels — one they acquire from the Lord, who bends everything bad toward good.
