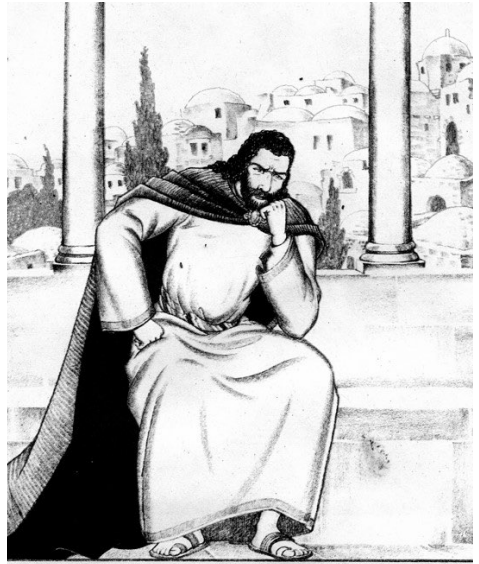


Why Christ Was Born
