

Teachings of the New Church

The disciples putting their garments on the donkey and her colt meant that truths in the whole complex were submitted to the Lord as the Highest Judge and King. The disciples represented the Church of the Lord in respect to its truths and goods, and their garments represented the truths themselves. The same was meant by the multitude putting their garments in the way, and also branches of trees. The reason why they put them in the way was that by “a way” is meant the truth by which the person of the church is led. For when the highest judges and kings rode in their solemn procession, the princes of the people then put their garments on the donkeys and mules, and the people themselves strewed their garments on the road, or in their place the branches of trees. For the judicial function in heaven is the Divine truth from the Divine good, and the regal one is the Divine truth.
